Fourth Sunday of Advent

FROM AGE TO AGE AND PLACE TO PLACE

There is a teaching from the rabbis that "When Israel wanders, God stays with them; when Israel stays in one place, God wanders." Of course God never left the chosen people; this is the rabbis' way of saying that human beings can get too grounded in earthly things and dwelling places. Our hearts get crowded, there is no room, and so God must wander. The people of ancient Israel were for much of their history a nomadic, wandering, tribal people. Their time in the desert and their years of exile in Babylon were the high points of their religious formation. Many feared that if a mortal ascended the throne of Israel as king, then God would be dethroned as the true king of Israel. Likewise they feared that if God had a permanent dwelling or temple, then they would no longer know the *shekinah* of God, their term for God pitching a tent in their midst, joining them as a companion in their journey. These fears underlie the voice of the prophet Nathan in today's first reading.

A PLACE FOR GOD TO DWELL

In a few short days, on Christmas morning, we will hear John's Gospel account of the incarnation: "And the Word became Flesh, and came to dwell among us" (John 1:14). John uses the Greek version of *shekinah* to emphasize that Jesus, God among us, pitched his tent on earth to be our companion on our journey. For much of his earthly ministry, Jesus was an itinerant preacher, a nomad. While most of us live in permanent places and are not called to this kind of mobility, we would do well to ask if there is still a place in our hearts for Jesus to pitch his tent. As we have surely heard and read over the past several weeks, we ought to "keep Christ in Christmas." This is a lesson for all seasons today, a lesson that Israel struggled to learn, a lesson that our own Church has struggled with as it assumed the trappings of earthly status. We need to make sure that when God-in-Flesh comes knocking at our door, we can respond that there is plenty of room within.

Cuarto Domingo de Adviento

DE EDAD EN EDAD Y DE SITIO EN SITIO

Hay una enseñanza de los rabinos que dice que "Cuando Israel vaga, Dios permanece con ellos; cuando Israel se detiene en un sitio, Dios vaga". Claro que Dios nunca abandonó a su pueblo escogido; esta es la forma de los rabinos decir que los seres humanos pueden apegarse demasiado a las cosas y a los hogares terrenales. Nuestro corazón está atiborrado, no hay espacio, y Dios tiene que alejarse. El pueblo del antiguo Israel fue, por gran parte de su historia un pueblo nómada, errante, tribal. Su tiempo en el desierto y sus años en el exilio de Babilonia fueron los puntos sobresalientes de su formación religiosa. Muchos temían que si un mortal subía al trono de Israel como rey, Dios iba a ser destronado como verdadero rey de Israel. Igualmente temían que si Dios fijaba su morada en el templo, ya no conocerían la *shekinah* de Dios, el símbolo de que Dios colocaba una tienda en medio de ellos uniéndose a ellos como compañero en sus viajes. Estos temores se reflejan en la voz del profeta Natán en la primera lectura de hoy.

UN SITIO PARA QUE DIOS HABITE

Dentro de pocos días, en la mañana de Navidad, oiremos la narración de la Encarnación en el Evangelio de Juan: "Y el Verbo se hizo carne y habitó entre nosotros". Juan usa la versión griega de *shekinah*, para enfatizar que Jesús, Dios con nosotros, armó su tienda en la tierra para ser nuestro compañero de viaje. Por casi todo su ministerio en la tierra, Jesús fue un predicador itinerante, un nómada. Aunque la mayoría de nosotros vive en sitios permanentes y no somos llamados a esta clase de movilidad, sería bueno que nos preguntáramos si aún hay lugar en nuestro corazón para que Jesús arme su tienda. Seguramente hemos oído y leído durante las últimas semanas, que debemos "conservar el nacimiento de Cristo en la Navidad". Esta es una lección para todas las estaciones hoy, una lección que Israel aprendió con dificultad, una lección con la que nuestra Iglesia ha luchado al asumir los adornos del estado terrenal. Necesitamos estar seguros de que cuando Dios hecho Carne toca nuestra puerta, podremos responder que hay suficiente espacio adentro.
